During times of uncertainty in our lives, much like the times that many of us are going through during this period of adjustment, two things have always been (and will continue to be) constants – taxation, and mortality. How you choose to handle your personal finances while you are alive is your own business, but have you given much thought to how your finances will be handled after you have passed away? Shockingly, a large portion of society has not legally prepared themselves and their estates for this eventuality. The consequences of not having a legal direction for your worldly possessions after you pass on can be severe, and leaving it to your surviving loved ones is both unfair and costly. Unfair because those who are left to grieve your passing should not be burdened with a lengthy quagmire of legal hurdles to overcome to receive what is (or should be) rightfully theirs. Costly because without a legal will, and predetermined power of attorney over your estate, the government will be the recipient of most of it, and will force your remaining loved ones a lengthy and costly legal struggle to sort it all out.

Most people assume that if you don't have a will when you pass away that everything will automatically go to your next of kin, however, this is far from the case. You can read more about this subject at:

Of immediate importance after your demise will be a funeral, which in Ontario can range in price from \$7500 to \$10000 for a basic funeral package. If you don't have a will, directing a portion of your estate to cover the cost of your funeral, this cost will be passed on to those who cared about you, who are probably not prepared to take on this cost out of pocket.

We all work very hard to provide for our families and love ones while we are alive, take the time to sit down with your family and discuss ways that they will be provided for and taken care of after you have passed away. There are many ways to prepare your estate, some costly, some not. How your estate is handled should be left up to you and your loved ones, and I urge you to take the time to visit this issue with your family.
